Salmon Habitat Sustains Livelihood and Lifestyle

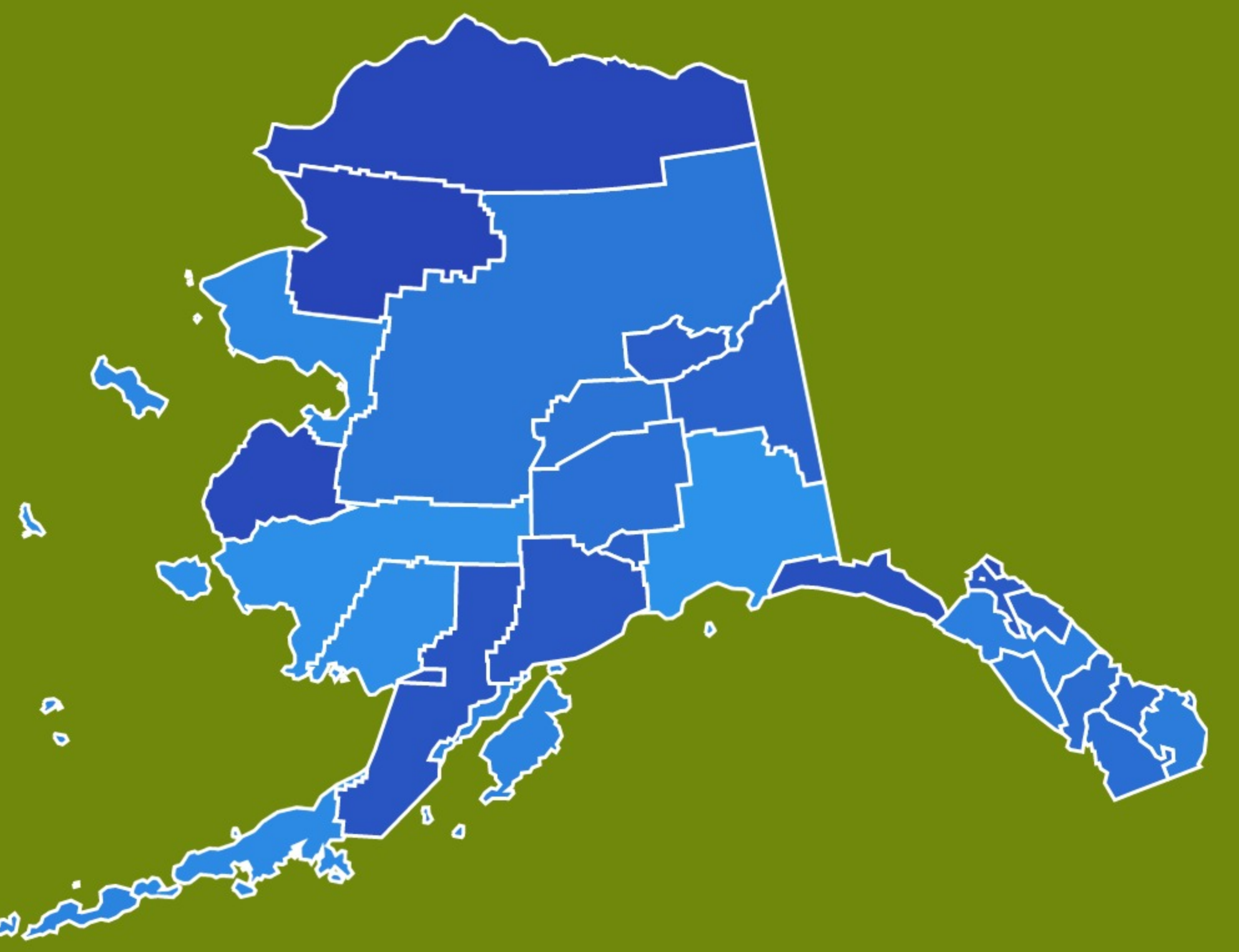
100% of fishermen surveyed care deeply about Alaska salmon habitat – for sustaining jobs, identity, self worth, and family.



Mining and Climate Change Top Habitat Concerns

Fishermen are concerned about a variety of habitat issues, with mining, climate change, and pollution concerns rising to the surface.

The Pebble Mine and transboundary mines were most often mentioned as specific issues.



Fishermen Speak Up for Habitat

93% of fishermen have taken action on behalf of salmon habitat in the last year, including talking to other fishermen, donating, signing petitions, & calling / writing decision makers.
